




2016 Group A Crime

Since 2006: (1,535 fewer crimes)




2016 Armed Robberies

Highest Year: 1975 = 49




2016 Auto Thefts





2016 Burglary



2016 Compared to 30 Year Averages











(2016 Farmington Hills)

- Use of Force (2%, 2,323 arrests)
- Taser Deployments (3)
- Citizens Killed (zero)
- Police Officers Killed (zero)
- Number of mistake opportunities (27,504 police runs, 80,981 Non emergency phone calls, 38,472 Emergency 911 calls, 2,323 arrests)
- Professional Michigan Law Enforcement

Reasons for Optimism

(confidence in police is high)

- 2016 Gallup Poll, 76% of Americans have a great deal of respect for the police in their area.
- White support up 11%
- Non-White support up 14%
- Highest level of confidence in police since 1967
- Michigan Public Policy Survey: 94% Satisfied with Police (40% excellent, 48% good)
